He also served as vice president of Cyburt Hall Partners, a boutique Los Angeles firm, focused on opportunistic investments and developments with institutional joint venture partners.

Born and raised in Honolulu, Johnstone attended Punahou School and Stanford University, where he obtained a bachelor's degree in economics with honors. Through his career, he has spearheaded more than \$4.5 billion of real estate investment activity.
