The curriculum encompasses a comprehensive exploration of technical, conceptual, historical, and contemporary accounting issues. Through an in-depth examination of the bookkeeping system, students are expected to acquire a fundamental grasp of reporting financial transactions.

**Class Participation**

### **Attendance**

Absences without pressing reasons indicate disinterest in the course and will reflect on your grade.

### **Homework (Connect)**

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Homework is an important part of this course and a key to your success. Accounting is a field where practice is particularly important. The homework problems are selected to ensure that you practice and understand key concepts.

You are required to complete the assigned problems for each week and submit your answers electronically through Connect **by Monday 11:59pm of that week**. Late submission will **NOT** be accepted, so I encourage you to plan ahead. The assigned problems are listed in Connect and can be submitted at any time before the deadline.

You have unlimited attempts for each homework and the highest score among your attempts will count towards your final homework grade. You do not have to complete multiple attempts – this is simply an option available to you.

Your homework submissions must be the result of *your own work*. However, I encourage you to work in groups and/or ask questions of classmates and help classmates. This is the key: Do not give or request “the answer,” but instead give or request help on *how* to do the problems.

### **Quizzes**

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We will have three quizzes. The quizzes are intended to ensure that you are keeping up with the class and will focus on the material of the preceding five weeks. However, accounting is by its nature cumulative, and material earlier in the course may appear on the later quiz. You are responsible for all of the material covered up through the date of the quiz (lectures, assignments, readings, etc.). Note that lectures will include material that is not in the textbook, and vice-versa. The format of the quizzes will be multiple choice, and questions will be similar to the homework assignment questions. The quizzes will be closed book and notes. However, you may use one double-sided 8 ½ x 11” note sheet. Make-ups for the quiz will only be allowed if you have an approved excuse and if you notify me prior to the date and time of the exam. Failure to do so, or lack of a valid reason for your absence, will result in a score of zero for the quiz.
