Will study at Chuou Univ., Spring, 2024 6. Keito (Kate) Ioroi Undergraduate student, Shidler College of Business, UH at Manoa, Major, Travel industry management, Tourism/transportation emphasis. Will study at Sophia Univ., Spring, 2024 Total: \$30,000 and \$5000 was awarded to 6 students. The credits that UH students earn at Japanese universities will be transferred towards their degrees at UH. Due to Japanese tax law restrictions on the Honjo Foundation, the funds for this fellowship stay in Japan in yen and are remitted to the recipients' bank accounts directly by the Honjo Foundation. The Honjo Foundation was established in Japan in 1996 by the late Mr. Masanori Honjo, the founder of Itoen Corporation of Japan, with his own assets. Itoen Corp. has made substantial contributions towards UH activities (particularly in athletics and arts and sciences dept.) through the UH Foundation. For details of Honjo Foundation, visit the website: https://www.hisf.or.jp/en/ The Honjo Foundation hosts various activities in Japan for foreign students under their fellowships to help the students become a good part of their Japanese universities and communities. For these foreign students, they arrange a few get-acquainted parties, athletic gatherings, study-tours and student lecture series to show their research results, in order to let the students get to know each other and help each other. The Honio Foundation is one of the largest and most prestigious scholarship funds in Japan, which provides about \$1 million a year mainly to students in Asia who wish to come to Japan to study. In the US, the Foundation provides a similar fellowship at the University of Southern California (USC) and Columbia University, in addition to this fellowship program at UH. Objectives of the fellowship: 1. To encourage graduate and undergraduate students of the University of Hawaii to study or do research at Japanese universities (Waseda, Keio, Hitotsubashi, Sophia, University of Tokyo, and other appropriate universities). 2. To encourage graduate students of those Japanese universities to study at the University of Hawaii Fellowship Amount and Number of Recipients: A total fellowship amount of \$30,000 shall be granted to five or six recipients a year. If there are no qualified applicants in a given year, the fellowship for that year will not be granted.
