

Academic Assessment Tool

<u>Proctorio</u> is a web browser extension required for this course section for the students to complete all proctored assignments in Connect. McGraw Hill partners with Proctorio, which provides <u>browser-locking</u> and <u>remote proctoring solutions</u>, to incorporate seamless academic integrity within Connect.

Assignments with Proctorio

They will be clearly labeled with "Proctoring Enabled" in the assignment title. When you start a proctored assignment, the proctoring settings selected by the instructor will be indicated. Typically, moderate settings (at no additional costs to the students) are selected for this course section.

ADVISORY: Potential academic integrity violation will be at the sole judgment of the instructor.

Privacy

Proctorio is a trusted resource for remote proctoring as the company is committed to student privacy. Proctorio uses a single sign-on through Connect. Only the instructor of this course section will have access to your exam data. Proctorio will never require personally identifiable information from students or sell your data to third parties. Security

Proctorio runs as an extension in select browsers only – Chrome, Edge, Brave, Opera – during your proctored Connect assignments. Proctorio has limited access to your computer system, unlike installed software applications that have complete access to your computer's hard drive or other resources. You may uninstall the extension after your proctored assignment ends for peace of mind, however, you must reinstall the extension again prior to starting the next proctored assignment.

Proctorio cannot see your proctored assignment data. All student data is secured with zero-knowledge encryption, which scrambles and renders student data unreadable outside of the course learning platform.
